2. Public comments

Robert Dager – Robert Dagger provided updates on the Santa Susana Mountain Park Association's work and asked everyone to visit http://ssmpa.com and read Comparative Analysis of Background versus Risk-based Cleanup Scenarios for the Soils at Santa Susana Field Laboratory, Ventura County, California to form a opinion on the clean up. He also mentioned that the clean up drastically affects our community.

<u>Tom Nactrab</u>: Tom Nactrab provided updated on CAG and mentioned that the activity and interest in the cleanup process is heating up.

Robert McBroom, Director of Pierce College Farm Center: He informed the Board that Pierce College is shutting down the farm. He stated that the college is getting rid of the farm and will give it to developers for commercial development. He sought CNC's support to seek independent state investigation to find the real reason behind the college's decision to end the lease of the Farm Center and terminate the public private partnership. He presented the attached letter to CNC for review. Pierce College decided to terminate the lease of the privately owned center, stating that it cannot financially sustain the farm.

<u>Nicholas Montano</u>: He informed the board about the upcoming Chatsworth Kiwanis Holiday Parade on December 14, 2014. He further informed CNC that all the permits for the parade were acquired. He asked the members to donate to Chatsworth Kiwanis to help with their holiday parade.

<u>Ankur Patel</u>: He informed CNC that the election day for the new CNC members is March 21st. The voting will be from 10 am to 4 pm at Chatsworth Metro Depo. The budget for this CNC election is \$1500. He further informed CNC that 10 candidates will be elected out of 20.

Lucie Volotzky: Lucy Volotzky announced that Chatsworth will host 100 athletes for the World Special Olympics. CSUN will host 500 athletes. Athletes will arrive on July 21st and leave on July 24h. The Special Olympics start on July 25th. She also mentioned that she will provide more information as more details emerge.

Megan Cottier (Councilman Mitch Englander's office): Megan Cottier provided the following information to CNC: 1)
Chatsworth Park South – Bids are due back in January 2015. Department needs 2-3 weeks to review the bids. 2) 14-1622

Assembly Bill – It allows the cities to regulate massage parlors. She sought resolution from CNC to support this bill. 3) Save Our Street Assembly Bills (14-1569/1571/1571 S1)- All these provide project co-ordination between different agencies. It also seeks full cost recovery for the street cut as opposed to just filing the permit fee and street damage restoration fee is extended to 3 years from 1 year, unless in an emergency. 4) Councilman's office is collecting Toys for PALs and asked public to drop off the toys at the community center.
